JULY - SEPTEMBER 2018**

We are pleased to report that the Chhattisgarh program is on track and we have focused and delivered on recruitment, training and equipment up-time.

HIGHLIGHTS

150 nurses who were placed at CHC and PHC have been trained by Mentor Nurses in Dantewada.

Baseline Quality Assessment competed at 39 PHCs and CHCs in Bastar, Jagdalpur and Narayanpur district in **ISHA project**.

19 Sick Newborn Care Units were functional in 17 districts.

667 cold calls were made to SNCU staff for gathering the information about unit.

Total **32 Public Health Centers and 3 Community Health Centers** were visited in Dantewada.

557 blood samples were collected from different SNCUs.

A total of **77 preventive visits** were made by the Bio Medical engineers during this quarter.

A total of **10 breakdown calls** were registered from different districts in this quarter.

BASELINE QUALITY ASSESSMENT

Improving System for Health Care Ability (ISHA) was started by Ekam Foundation in three districts (Bastar, Narayanpur and Bijapur) of Chhattisgarh, which was funded by UNICEF. The main objective of this program was to improve the theoretical and practical knowledge of Staff nurses regarding maternal and neo natal health at all PHCs and CHCs in these districts. 8 mentor nurses were recruited for this project.

The baseline assessment was done to know about the current status on following indicators like

- **trained HR,**
- **infrastructure,**
- **quality of services,**
- **equipment details,**
- **drugs, and**
- **Commodities of facilities.**

For the baseline assessment 40 facilities were selected in 3 districts. For this UNICEF and Ekam Foundation conducted two day training on September 26th and 27th, 2018, in Department of Community medicine, Baliram Kashyap Medical College, Jagdalpur.

At the end of the training, the overall knowledge of mentor nurses was found to have increased by 50% to 70%.

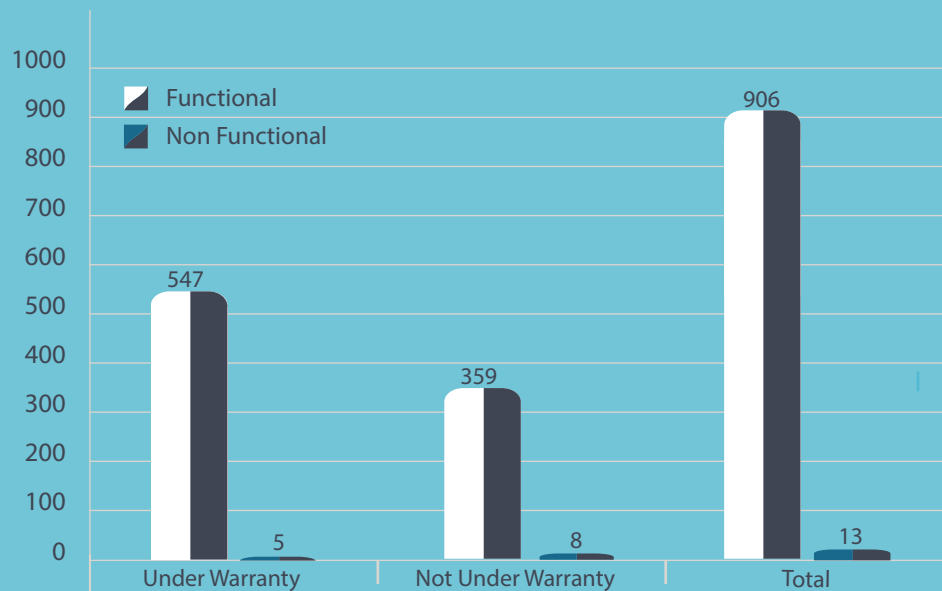
EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE

Properly functioning medical equipment can be a critical tool for any healthcare professional as it allows him to manage and perform all sorts of functions from the emergency room to the operating table more accurately. If a piece of medical equipment fails, the quality of patient care can decrease, which can even affect patient safety. Therefore; a very important feature of any intensive care unit is equipment maintenance.

DANTEWADA PROJECT

- A total of 54 preventive visits were made at District Hospital, Community Health Center and Public Health Centers in Dantewada in this quarter.
- Mentor Nurses visited a total of 31 PHCs and 6 CHCs for field training.
 - Total 150 nurses received the training.
